

C. Selection of grant programs supporting employment

Figure C1 provides an overview of a selection of grant programs that support employment. This is focused on the 3 departments with an economic development function that had total payments between 2021 to 2023 of more than \$5 million and where we categorised the payment as relating to 'employment'.

It is not an exhaustive list of all grant programs that may contribute to supporting employment.
